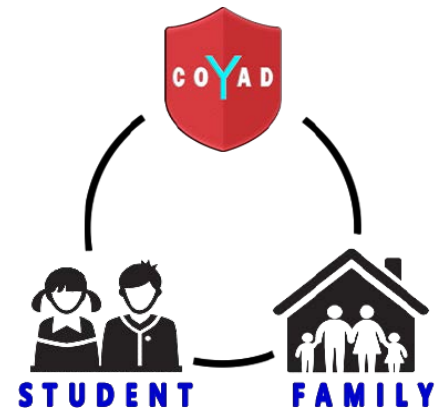

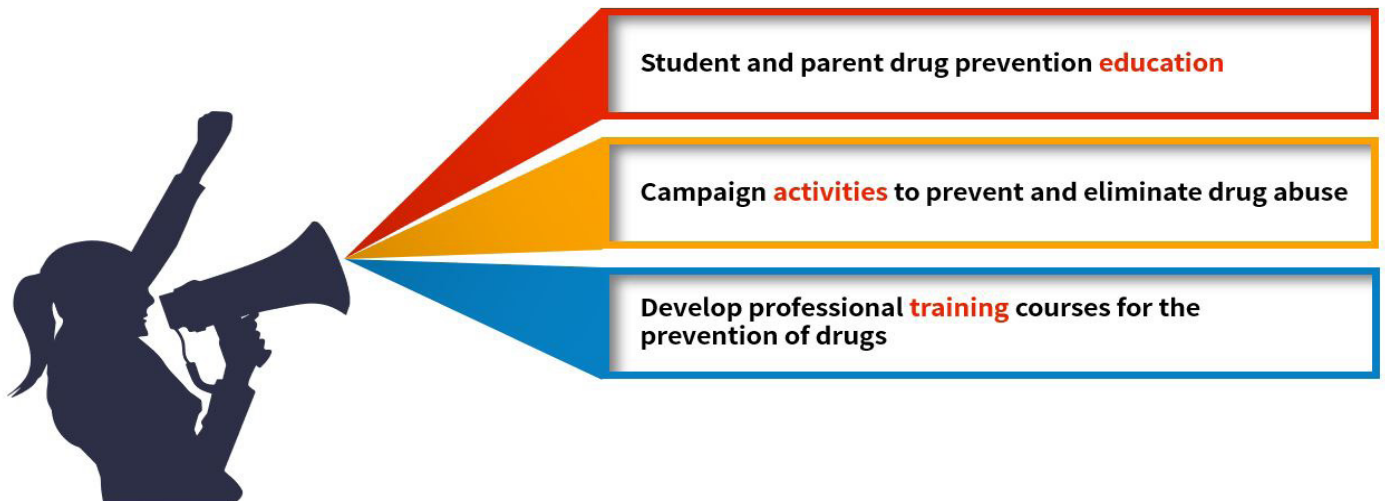

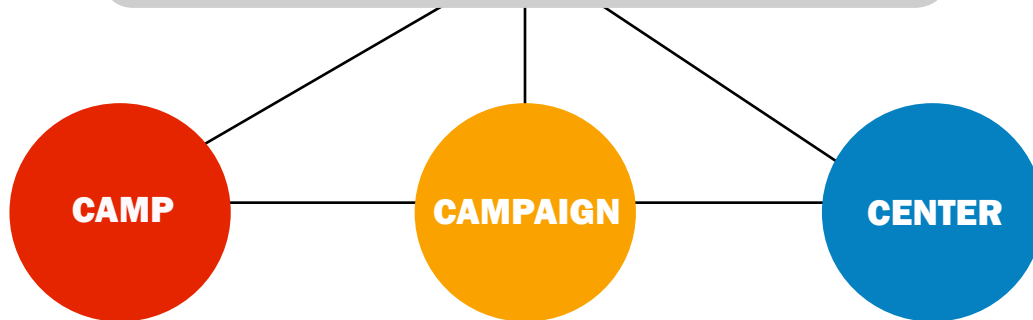

Camp

Objective: Communication, Relationship, and Friendship in the field

Goal: Build COYAD Camp (Drug Prevention Clubs) in each school

Target: Student Leaders in each school and college

Plan: Meeting once every month about given agenda

Campaign

Objective: Outreach, Take Action, Unite Together

Goal: Inform the importance of drug prevention and create opportunities for people to participate in our campaign

Target: Everyone in our community

Partnership: Similar organization and etc.

Plan 1:

- 1) Invite people to COYAD meetings
- 2) Make them join to become COYAD members

Plan 2:

- 1) Anti-Drug Campaign with all communities
- 2) Advertise and broadcast through mass media
- 3) Campaign visiting other states and countries

Center

Objective: Educate and train Leaders and specialists

Goal: Find and train student leaders, educate parents

Target: Students, parents, staff & volunteers

Plan:

- 1) Intensive leadership training four times a year
- 2) Drug prevention education
- 3) COYAD IC & RC education
- 4) President's volunteer service award

Middle & High School CAMP

1. Educate Middle & High school student members through COYAD academic and project class
Student members will be educated on anti-drug curriculum in each class
2. Organize COYAD School camp at each school
Student Team Leaders (Founders) will recruit members at school and have campaign meetings at their school
3. Student members will be given credits for each COYAD class and activity

\$1 Million Donation - Support 300 Middle or High School camps

College CAMP

1. Organize COYAD college camp at each school
Student Team Leaders will recruit members at school and have campaign meetings
- 2. Student team leaders from 300 college/university will be given \$3,000 a year in scholarships.**

\$1 Million Donation - 300 college/university camps

\$2 Million Donation - 600 college/university camps

\$3 Million Donation - 900 college/university camps

COYAD COLLEGE LEADER'S DUTIES DESCRIPTIONS

1. College camp: minimum once a month on campus or outside the facility.
2. **Recruit 12 or more COYAD college members on campus or outside the campus.** (College Camp would be separated into another camp if it exceeds more than 12 members.)
3. Every event and gatherings both on and off campus requires taking pictures and/or video clips with "COYAD Shield" signs which needs to be submitted to the college director. Then, leader needs to create a Facebook page for their respective college/university.
4. The post-meeting report needs to be submitted to the college director with comments and thoughts from other members (i.e. how COYAD can improve to accomplish the mission on Anti- Drug Prevention in future events or gatherings.)*See COYAD College Camp report form.
5. Utilize the scholarship program to recruit students with high morals and values to be future college leaders and continue our COYAD mission on campus. Leader has to recommend options for next leader before leaving his/her school.
6. College leader needs to discuss scholarship details with COYAD College Director.
7. All college leaders will need to attend COYAD annual college leader's meeting.

This is an organization that operates commissioned concerning the situations of the education and credential of addiction of Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) under the influence of the U.S. Department of Labor (DoL).
